From the desk of the General Secretary...

World Alliance of YMCAs and APAY

After our APAY Executive Committee Meeting in March, I attended the World Alliance of YMCAs (WAY) Executive Committee Meeting held in Geneva and I would like to share my thoughts and impressions about the worldwide movement.

There are 30 Executive Committee members of the WAY with a balance representation of age, gender and region including 3 officers and the 4 area presidents.. The members represent the 7 regions/ areas ~ Asia and Pacific, Africa, Canada, Europe, Latin America and Carib-

bean, Middle East, and USA. From our area, we have the following Executive members: Ms. Helen McEwan (New Zealand) ~ Treasurer, Judge Edilberto Claravall (Philippines), Mr. Oliver Loke (Singapore) – Youth Representative, Ms. Hiromi Nagao (Japan), Mr. Babu Gomes (Bangladesh), and Dr. Park Jai Chang, APAY President.

Their Executive Committee meets only once a year. Their key to success is by keeping most of their members actively engaged and aligned with a common agenda. “Youth Empowerment” will be the

Another thing that is unique and unexpected is the position of the youth. There are 8 youth members (below 30 years of age) among the Executive Committee. For the last four years, WAY had a Youth Committee who talked about youth issues and organized Youth Forum. For this new term, no Youth Committee was formed; rather youth were challenged to take part of the three committees: Finance, Governance, and Image and Branding.

In 2006 World Council in South Africa, the "Vision 2014" was discussed. One thought that I could still clearly remember was "In 2014, there will be no Youth Forum to be done separately from the World Council because the youth will be the majority of the World Council." It was well received by the audience with a big applause. Yes, I strongly agree to this proposition that the young people should be highly encouraged and challenged within the YMCA, for them to be vigilant, to voice out their thoughts and contribute meaningfully to the YMCA movements as equally as senior volunteers.

One big change I felt in the World Alliance is that they are very determined to fully involve and integrate the Regional and National movements with their current direction. The YMCA is a worldwide organization -- the biggest youth organization in the world. However, people outside YMCA do not see us as who we want to be. Our works are so diverse sending so many different messages to the world. Or we must have failed in bridging con-

cretely the message that we want to convey to them. Each movement is doing a lot and has made impacts to young people and communities. We need a common and strong brand as to "Who we are?" and "What we do?" The next four years will be the challenge of work alignments of the World Alliance (1) to the Area Alliances (7) towards the National movements (125) down to the local movements (10,000). We have over 45 million members worldwide. Indeed a huge organization. All are unique and autonomous yet has a strong

identity as YMCA movement.

As World Alliance initiates, let's all move toward our common goal, which is "Youth Empowerment". Assuredly, APAY is fully aligned with this goal through our Global Citizenship Education and Youth Driven activities in various fields on Interfaith Cooperation, Environment and Alternative Tourism, Migrant and Employment, and Gender Justice and Equality...

Embarking to a new 4-year direction, we all move towards a common goal. Together, we, the YMCA, will all make one concrete step towards "Youth Empowerment". (Kohei Yamada, APAY -General Secretary)

Participating movements for the *Witness Room* have already been identified. This will be the space to share some selected good practices of the YMCAs in the region in line with the quadrennial thrusts. This is the time to share, learn and reflect how relevant we are to our community and how we have been.

Community Exposures to realities and issues are in the process of finalisation. We will have exposure-model for alternative tourism project. Registered participants will receive Exposure-Sign up form prior to the Assembly for necessary logistical requirements as some exposures are located at the Penang Island which are between an hour or less than 2 hours from the main city of Penang.

Strategic Dialogue on 7 major areas that include gender,

resource mobilization, environment, alternative tourism, YMCA leadership and governance, youth empowerment and engagement, and movement strengthening will lead us towards the realisation of our mission for the next quadrennial 2012-2015.

Cambodia YMCA PSG Members Conduct Training



A series of basic training for Cambodia YMCA (CYMCA) board members, volunteers and staff were conducted by some members of the Partners Support Group (PSG) during 19-27 March 2011. Mr. Richard Kaing, APAY Special Project Officer started with the Forum on Constitution and Manual for Board/Volunteers, Committees and Staff. The participants were also introduced to YMCA as international ecumenical youth movement and its imperatives. In his session on Membership, Mr. Sunny Wu of Chinese YMCA of Hong Kong (representing the Hong Kong Council) gave emphasis on the importance of YMCA members ~ understanding the mission, culture of service and importance of Christian spirit. He shared some categories of membership and strategies for recruitment campaigns. Mr. Ron Mell of Perth YMCA, Australia, facilitated an interactive, experiential learning approach on Governance. The session included project development with the current constraints of CYMCA. Financial management and basic accounting procedures were conducted by Mr. Andrew Leo of Singapore YMCA. The PSG members hoped that this training had provided the participants more understanding of YMCA and an opportunity for growth which could sustain them within a couple of years.

Historic Gender Assembly of the YMCAs of India

First to gather both men and women...

The National Council of YMCAs of India (NCYI) organized a National Women's/Gender Assembly at YMCA Greater Noida Programme Centre from 29 April to 1 May 2011 with YMCA New Delhi as hosts.

Mr. Anjan Mukherjee, Secretary of the National Programmes and Women's Empowerment & Gender Concerns, shared that this was the eighth in a series of annual conclave of women staff persons/lay-leaders/members and the very first gender assembly of its kind in the history of the Indian YMCA Movement. Some 79 delegates comprising men and women including 53 from outstation covering eight of the nine YMCA Regions of India attended the three-day Assembly on the theme, *Gender Parity: Pathway to a Common Humanity*. Four sub-sessions were gone through which included Encouraging Equal Access to Opportunities, Promoting Gender-Mainstreaming and Gender-integration within the YMCA, Towards Gender-Sensitization within the YMCA and Promoting Capacity-building and Women's Enablement in the YMCAs with a

parallel discussion on the topic Women Creating a Safe World. Several noted specialists and experts from civil society and NGOs were invited as resource persons and panellists.

The Chairperson of the Delhi Social Welfare Board, Dr. Mrs. Sudharshan Pathak, a noted social activist and renowned woman sports-person, inaugurated the seminar as Chief-Guest. Dr. Patcharawan Srisilapanan, Chairperson of our APAY Gender Equity Committee, delivered an impressive address and witnessed the whole program. The Assembly adopted a five-point resolution stressing on the need for organizing gender-sensitization workshops for YMCA members and the community; affirmation of support for the passage of the Women's Reservation Bill through mass mobilization programs and representations by local YMCAs and the National Council among other well-intentioned goals. Dignitaries of the NCYI and the local hosts graced this historic gender

gathering having both men and women.
