As announced in our March eNewsletter issue, **YMCA Regional Youth Conference with the theme 'STEP-UP: ENCOURAGE, EDUCATE, ENGAGE'**, will be held on **17-22 July 2012 at National University of Singapore ~U-Town and to be hosted by the YMCA of Singapore.**

The conference is jointly organized by APAY Youth Participation and Leadership Development (YPLD) Committee and the University Students Group of the YMCA of Singapore as part of the celebration of YMCA

of Singapore's 110th Anniversary. Previously, this program was known as 'Asia-Pacific University Youth-Regional Conference. Through program evaluation activities, concerns with the 'inclusiveness' of the program title arose; thus, resulting with the revision of the program's name. From this year, the program will be known as 'YMCA Regional Youth Conference'. This will embody the purpose of the program which is to serve as an avenue for various youth groups (Uni-Y, College-Y, Campus-Y, Student-Y, Youth Club, etc.)

Go Green in Chiang Mai

The Asia and Pacific Alliance of YMCAs is striving to educate the stakeholders of the YMCAs towards a behavioral change to reduce YMCAs own carbon footprint and advocate for ecological justice. As a part of this continuous endeavor, the APAY envisions to train 30 Green Ambassadors from amongst the YMCAs of our region. The Green Ambassadors Training shall take place during 21-

25 May, 2012 in Chiang Mai, Thailand.

National YMCA Movements are encouraged to send YMCA staff or lay leaders for this training program. We expect that the participants of the program subsequently shall play a leadership role in implementing green activities in their respective YMCAs. A follow up advanced training will be held in the 2013 for the participants of this pro-

gram, who had successfully implemented effective green programs in their own YMCAs.

The Registration Fee is US\$ 30 (including Green Fund Fee) and the Participation Cost is US\$ 200. Limited subsidies are available for deserving candidates. National Movements are encouraged to send participants for this Training Program.

From the desk of the General Secretary...

Youth Empowerment: YMCA Priority for the Next 4 Years

As APAY has set the Strategic Plan for 2012-15, the core and priority goal will be Youth Empowerment. The APAY Youth Committee proposed to have Youth Representatives. This is a pool of young staff and volunteers which we call 'Youth Reps' for short; hence, will work closely and collectively for the next four years.

What does Youth Empowerment mean? How do we know if APAY Youth Empowerment goal is successful? Meeting this goal would mean that we would be hearing a stronger Youth voice in APAY, national and local associations. Moreover, many young people would actively engage with in creating youth programs as well as responding to social issues in local and global communities. For this goal, the Youth Reps, together with the Youth Committee members, would be more involved in YMCA structure, locally, nationally, and globally.

APAY has requested the National movements in selecting the proper candidates for Youth Reps. Those Youth Reps need to be supported so that they can represent the youth's voice in respective decision making structures such as in National or Local board and their committees. It would be important for the Youth Reps to be invited to the board meetings.

Another expectation in the APAY strategic plan is to increase youth groups and youth activities in YMCAs. The YMCA Regional Youth Conference (Singapore in July 2012) is being held annually. This serves as a platform for introducing and sharing youth empowerment program models from different youth groups. YMCA activities in Universities and Colleges have been growing in several countries. We need to intentionally create such opportunities for youth to develop their leadership and experiences of being empowered. The Global Citizenship Education, School of Peace, Uni Y, College Y, Campus Y, and Student Y are spaces where youth can be empowered. We, by sharing such good models, could improve our existing programs to encourage and empower more young people.

Lastly, the Global Citizenship Education (GCE) is a

good tool for empowering young people. More and more youth will be creating local actions in their own communities. GCE makes young people become more responsible citizens. GCE promotes socially relevant actions among youth. Youth Reps will be the promoters and initiators of GCE actions in each community. Therefore, the program in Sri Lanka (August 7-12, 2012) will be the starting point for the Youth Reps. Each Youth Rep will learn how to promote GCE in their movement, and how to increase youth lead activities in national and local YMCAs.

During this quadrennial term (2012-15), Youth Reps who receive trainings in 2012 and 2013 and who are fulfilling their responsibilities will be sent to the World Council in July 2014 (in USA). Finally, they are expected to attend APAY General Assembly in September 2015 to represent the Youth voice from their national movements. At the same time the Youth Reps will hold the Youth Assembly, where they discuss another strategic direction toward 2016-2019.

We believe that this Youth Empowerment Strategic Plan and various activities related to the Youth Reps will create big impacts in the YMCA movements in the world. The YMCA is such place where many young people feel empowered through its YMCA activities in local settings as well as through the global network. I am sure those Youth Reps will be our future leaders in the YMCA movements in all countries.

APAY-GS Shares WAY's Executive Committee Meeting 2012

Officers and Executive Committee members met in Nairobi. From the Asia-Pacific area, the ECM members who attended were: Ms. Helen McEwan (Treasurer), Mr. Joshua Yau Chung Wan (APAY-President), Mr. Babu Gomes (APAY-Vice President), and Mr. Oliver Loke (APAY-YPLD Committee Member).

Progresses and Challenges in 2011

1. Youth Empowerment: Developed the Youth Empowerment as the main priority. The idea of Change Agents and Change Model have been focused. The World Alliance team of young people conducted research regarding the contemporary youth issues in different areas in which about 100 movements responded. World Challenge (scheduled on Oct. 13, 2012) has been prepared among 54 movements and received official support from

UNESCO and Federation of International Basketball Associations. The World Alliance has been closely working with United Nations. As an official representative of YMCAs' young people, Mr. Romulo Dantas (WAY-Executive Secretary) has been selected to be one of the advisory group members for the UN office.

2. MS: Movement Strengthening has been continuing as one of the major activities of the World Alliance. Governance and Leadership, Sustainability, Program Development and Communication (for more visibility) have been the focal aspects in this area.

3. RM: Resource Mobilization has been conducted after the Investor's Circle of the World Council in 2010. A total goal of 1 Million has been accomplished and four (4) areas have been working hard for their capacity development on Resource Mobilization. Strategic Collaboration with Y's Men, NAYDO and WUN has been built and concrete partnership has been started in Asia-Pacific and Africa areas.

4. Global Branding Strategies: Image and Impact Committee has been working for global branding strategies. The YMCA World Magazine has been issued twice this year; for the upcoming issues, publications will be made via web uploading only.

5. Governance of the World Alliance: Governance Model has been discussed and the Code of Conducts and Ethics has been developed. Evaluation of ECM itself and the works of the Secretary General have been done periodically.

6. Global Citizenship: Global Citizenship Dialogue was conducted in Penang last September after APAY's 18th General Assembly. Similar events will be conducted in all areas. Global Citizenship Book was published in collaboration with APAY.

7. Challenges felt by the World Alliance: 1) Economic recession made the WAY's interest income from JRM

funds much less; 2) Low visibility of YMCA in the world during the resource mobilization process; and 3) Lack of collective identity as a worldwide movement.

8. Plan and Strategy: New Focus on Youth Empowerment was discussed in the Stakeholders' Meeting. As agreed, the World Alliance needs to move concretely under the following three (3) main point agenda: 1) Hiring a Full-time Communications Specialist for the coming three (3) years; 2) Mobilizing 200 Change Agents from all YMCA movements in the world who will be trained in the area level then meet at the World Council; 3) Coordination will be done by rotation of 6 experienced staff for 2 month each from various member movements.

9. World Council Planning Committee: The World Council will be held from June 29 to July 5, 2014 in Colorado, USA, and Youth Forum and NGS meetings will be held from July 5 to 7. The theme will be "YMCA Empowering Young People". The World Council will invite 200 change agents. They will be trained in the Area levels in 2012-13, and they will share their experiences in the World Council. After the WC, they meet in Youth Forum jointly with NGSs for making follow-up plans for 2014-2018. The participants will approximately be around 1500 in which 500 will be youth members.

Resource Teams: The World Alliance will form the following Resource Teams for carrying out the NEW WAY strategies. The teams are headed by: 1) Youth Empowerment (Bob Cabeza of Long Beach Y, USA), 2) Resource Mobilization (Ghassan Sayah of Lebanon); 3) Social Enterprise (Peter Burns of Australia); 4) Global Citizenship (Dr. Park Jai Chang of Korea); 5) Environment (Jose Varghese of India); and 6) Student YMCA Leadership (Ashley Koloya of Y USA).

From March 31 to April 4, in Nairobi, Kenya, the world YMCA came together with 80 leaders from all continents at the Stakeholders meeting and the World Alliance Executive Committee. The leaders affirmed the following collective statement written above.

The world movement committed to advance a common focus and vision on youth empowerment in action. This agreement is centered on a common framework for a change model of youth empowerment focused on space, transformation, and impact. On a worldwide basis, YMCAs in all continents and communities work in youth empowerment. The NEW WAY Strategy has opened new perspectives so that YMCAs now will have the opportunity for increased coordination, learning, and sharing of our common work in youth empowerment. Through this coordinated effort YMCAs will achieve increased strength and visibility in programs, scale, and impact. With the affirma-

tion of the vision, the worldwide YMCA will now focus on implementation on youth empowerment in action in the NEW WAY.

The Global Staff Team - GST (composed of Area Executives from Africa, Asia and Pacific, Europe, Canada, Latin America and the Caribbean, USA, and the Middle East) met throughout the process in Nairobi and discussed key elements of the vision, the change model, impact measurement, the implementation plan, and resourcing the vision. The first action of the 2 year period is focused on the recruitment and training of the 200 Change Agents. The GST developed a consensus to work together to raise and leverage resources with local and national YMCAs to support the training, development, and integration of the 200 Change Agents.

It is anticipated that training will take place at the Area level between June and August 2013. A group training is planned to coincide with the Prague Festival in August 2013 where it is hoped that a large number

of the 200 Change Agents would be present. Training and action will continue to 2014 at the World Council (where all Change Agents will be present). This will be the opportunity to showcase and demonstrate results, evaluate the process, and plan for the next phase of implementation. A total 15 Trainers (from all continents) are planned to be recruited and identified over the next 90 days for training the Change Agents. The Change Agent training curriculum is planned to be developed by June, To assist with the implementation process, Resource Groups leaders (Peter Burns, Bob Cabeza, Ashley Kolaya, Dr. Park, Ghassan Sayah, and Jose Varghese) came together with World Alliance Executives (Johan Vilhelm Eltvik, Romulo Dantas, and Selma Zaidi) on April 16 and 17 to share the common vision of youth empowerment, discuss concrete actions to advance youth empowerment, and to identify resources, tools, and partners to implement the strategy.
