1. Yamada is New General Secretary

He was the Chairperson of the National General Secretaries of APAY.

The General Secretary has been attending the Executive Committee Meetings of both the APAY and the World Alliance and is greatly involved in several programmes/activities. He is an active member of Y's Men International. He is married to Mrs. Marlene F. Yamada and they have three (3) children.

2. Executive Committee Meeting Highlights

Eighty-eight representatives/leaders and partners of the region attended the Executive Committee Meeting held in Hong Kong on 25 to 27 March 2009.

In his **President's Address**, Dr. Park Jai Chang remarked that last year witnessed considerable actions by the standing committees of the APAY in furthering the Quadrennial thrusts. He cited some of the planned action responses and hoped that the respective standing committees would pay due consideration to develop effective implementation strategies for these programmes. He emphasised that various recommendations should likewise be given special attention and action.

The President said that his visits to several National movements had given him a sense of satisfaction and pride but some interactions disturbed him. He found the need to focus on movement strengthening and to capacitate emerging YMCAs towards self-reliance with local leadership, membership and resources.

The **Annual Report** highlighted the implementation of the 1st year of the Quadrennial Programme Plan (QPP) and key aspects of the work done by the APAY Secretariat and National Movements. The report concluded with a challenge as to the kind of

transformational change we are looking for in our communities, the right path to take and responses to undertake as we move forward with our mission.

To ensure an effective implementation of our QPP, a **Progress Report** (*Yr 1 Implementation*) was presented at the Executive Committee. This gave an opportunity to have more engagement and collective ownership of the whole QPP programme.

Dr. Bart Shaha, Secretary General of the World Alliance shared the World Alliance's Resource Mobilisation Plan and the World Council 2010 to be held in Hong Kong.

The **Report of the Search Committee** that recommended the appointment of the new APAY General Secretary was presented to the meeting

Our **ecumenical and YMCA partners** brought greetings. **The National General Secretaries** met on 24 March.

3. Regional Workshop on Global Alternative Tourism in Chiang Mai

National Movements are invited to join to a workshop on YMCA Global Alternative Tourism to be held on 27-30 June 2009 at YMCA Chiangmai, Thailand. The workshop aims at conceptualizing possible Alternatives in Tourism through theoretical inputs and practical exposures. It will bring together experts on Alternative Tourism together with YMCA lay and professional leaders across the Region towards developing strategies for YMCAs involvements. The workshop also hopes to develop a working mechanism for the proposed YMCA Global Alternative Tourism Network.

4. 2nd Asia & Pacific University Y Regional Conference 2009

As earlier circulated, the 2nd Uni-Y Regional Conference will be held from 29 July to 3 August to be hosted and co-organised by the YMCA of Singapore. The theme "Youth Revolution" encapsulates 2 key issues on youth leadership and social entrepreneurship. The Conference will consist of several participatory and interactive sessions/workshops with exposure visits and community service.

The programme aims to further the QPP thrust - *Sustainability of life for all* and to strengthen YMCA's engagements as global citizens in alleviating poverty and building sustainable communities.

7. 27th Advanced Studies Programme

Based on the quick survey conducted, a circular announcing the 27th Advanced Studies has been sent to National Movements. It will be held from 26 October to 29 November 2009 in YMCA Wu Kwai Sha Youth Village, Hong Kong. We are expecting about 12-14 professional secretaries to join this year's ASP.

On 23 – 31 May, young New Zealanders celebrated Youth Week 2009 that focused on relationships and highlighted the amazing things young people do. Youth Week is a yearly event about creating a society that values young people and affirms their diversity. The YMCA of New Zealand was a proud gold sponsor of this celebration.

9. International Youth Peace Camp in Timor Leste

The 4th International Youth Peace Camp will be held on 4-11 August 2009. It will provide an opportunity for Timorese youths and other youths from the region to meet and build mutual understanding as they work together for peace making and peace building, serving the community. It has helped, and will continue to strengthen the ANJUCTIL (YMCA of Timor Leste).

10. APAY Partnership Project: YMCA-RYLTI

Report by Mr. Pablito A. Tabucol, Assistant Program Secretary for Movement Strengthening, NCY Philippines

Twenty-two young University student leaders representing the various local YMCAs in the Philippines gathered together for the YMCA-Rizal Youth Leadership Training Institute (RYLTI) held on May 15-31. This 16-day intensive leadership training aimed at building young leaders into socially responsible global citizens. One of the outputs from the training is the individual action plan, to be implemented in their local YMCAs. Plans vary from Uni-Y organizing to the conduct of community socially relevant programmes responding to the needs of the youth in their respective communities. This programme is under the APAY Partnership Project (formerly MAP), supported by NCY Korea.

11. Sri Lanka YMCA Supports IDPs

The Sri Lanka YMCA is providing emergency support to internally displaced children and youth affected by the armed conflict. The YMCA's involvement is basically with children under 3 years in the IDP Camps, providing baby milk and nourishment. They intend to provide recreation and play therapy activities for children once the situation stabilizes.

The National Council as well as local YMCAs in Moratuwa, Mannar, Vavuniya, Point Pedro, and Jaffna are liaising directly with the government authorities to help identify and to address needs and monitor distribution of relief items. They also coordinated collections with churches, temples, and members of the public and transported all collected goods to the IDP camps. The YMCA is also networking with other organizations such as the National Christian Council of Sri Lanka (NCC-SL), Methodist Church, Anglican Church, and Evangelical Alliance. The World Alliance of YMCAs has made an appeal to all National Movements for financial support and Y Care is providing support for technical coordination.

12. Young Explorers Programme Fosters Global Citizenship

Report by Mr. Eric Wong, International and Mainland Affairs Section, Chinese YMCA of Hong Kong

In 2008, Chinese YMCA of Hong Kong launched the Young Explorers Programme (YEP), which fosters Global Citizenship. Since then, networks of working partnerships have been established with some YMCAs in the region and around the world.

This year, we have jointly organised a month-long internship exchange and cultural exposure for University YMCA members with YMCA of the Philippines. This is called the "Global YMCA Youth Trainee Programme", one of the inbound and outbound exchange programmes of YEP. Participants' shall have experiential learning through engagement in YMCA works and local communities. At the same time, it enhances their leadership capabilities, communication skills and sense of responsibility.

Since 10 May, we have 4 Uni-Ye'rs from the Philippines who are now involved in some of our international activities, youth and camp related programmes. The Uni-Y members of our Chinese YMCA are on outbound exchange for YMCA Philippines from 8 June 2009.

13. Executive Secretaries Attend Training on Rights-Based Approach

Our Executive Secretaries have been attending a Workshop Series on "Enhancing Advocacy in a Time of Crisis – Better Advocacy using the Rights–based Approach (RBA). The workshop uses RBA as a tool to develop more accurate analyses, effective strategies and appropriate tactics to deal with challenges to advocates of social justice/human rights. This training of 4 full-day sessions is organised by Asian Center for the Progress for Peoples (ACPP), one of our ecumenical partners.

14. Young Professional in WAY

Dr. Janet Chan of Chinese YMCA of Hong Kong was chosen as Young Professional of the World Alliance of YMCAs (WAY). She started her youth internship on March 2009 and will be directly involved in the preparations of the World Council 2010. This 27-year old young leader was a Uni-Y member and have participated in a wide range of activities in Y's Men Hong Kong District and with her own local YMCA.

15. EASY Net Appoints New Coordinator

After the selection process by the EASY Net Regional Core Team, Ms. Maria Cristina Miranda was appointed as its new Regional Coordinator beginning 1 April 2009. Ms. Miranda is not new to this ecumenical youth network, as she had participated in various regional EASY Net programmes/workshops.

16. 1st National YMCA Training for Female Staff

Report by Ms. Maki Enokita, Staff Intern, National Council of YMCAs of Japan

Twenty-three staff from 12 local YMCAs in Japan gathered for the 1st National YMCA Training Workshop for female staff on 14 May in Kobe YMCA. The workshop focused on "Using Our Talent to the Fullest at the YMCA". There are about 800 female regular staffs and 2000 part-time female staffs working in the YMCA. Ms. Toshiko Takeda, Vice President of the National Council and Chairperson of the Gender Committee emphasised that this training was designed for female workers to reflect their attitude towards work and to value their life.

The training was a good opportunity to raise awareness of women's role in sustaining family lives and promoting gender responsiveness within the YMCA. This will be a regular capacity building programme to advance women's roles as partners and leaders in the YMCA and community.

17. Mr. T. Thomas Retires from Professional Service

Mr. T. Thomas, National General Secretary of the National Council of YMCAs of India is retiring after 42 long years of Professional service from the YMCA Movement on 1st June 2009. He served in different capacities in India and abroad such as General Secretary of the Ernakulam YMCA, Director of Refugee Service in Sudan, General Secretary of Indian Student Hostel in London. He became the National General Secretary in the year 1998. He was Chair of the National General Secretaries of APAY.

We appreciate his services to the YMCA movement and wish him a blessed and healthy retired life.
